

Vegetable Garden Calendar

JANUARY

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Radish, Turnip, Spinach, French Beans, Peas, Cucumber, Lettuce, Tomato, and Sweet Corn.
- Plant seedlings of the following: Cabbage, Lettuce, and Endive.
- Earth up Celery as required, and give a good watering.
- Tie up Cos Lettuce to blanch them, and put flower pots over Endive for the same purpose.
- Put in Tomato seedlings, as plants raised in this way fruit earlier than those from seed.
- Fresh beds of Watercress may be made.

FEBRUARY

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Radish, Turnip, Spinach, French Beans, Peas, Cucumber, Lettuce, and Sweet Corn.
- Put out young plants of the following: Lettuce, Tomato, and Cucumber.
- Towards the end of the month Jerusalem Artichokes may be planted.
- Lettuce and Endive blanch for succession.
- Earth up Celery for succession.

MARCH

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Radish, Turnip, French Beans, Cucumber, Lettuce, and Sweet Corn.
- Plant out any seedlings ready from last month's sowings.
- Watercress may still be planted.
- Plant out Tomatoes raised from cuttings.
- Jerusalem Artichokes may still be planted.

APRIL

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Chinese Spinach, French Beans, Cucumber, Lettuce, and Sweet Corn.
- Plant out seedlings (raised last month) of Cucumber, and Lettuce.

MAY

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Chinese Spinach, French Beans, Cucumber, Lettuce, and Sweet Corn.
- Put out last month's seedlings of Cucumber, and Lettuce.
- Seedlings of Spinach may be planted.

JUNE

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Chinese Spinach, Cucumber, Lettuce, Sweet Corn, Short Beans, and Cabbage.

JULY

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Spinach, Cucumber, Lettuce, Sweet Corn, Beans, Celery, and Cabbage.

AUGUST

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Spinach, Lettuce, Sweet Corn, Cabbage, Celery, Tomatoes and Carrots.
- Dig over all vacant ground, so that it will be in good condition for sowing seeds in September and October.

SEPTEMBER

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Spinach, Lettuce, Sweet Corn, Cabbage, Radish, Beet, Carrot, Cabbage, Cauliflower, and Celery.
- Plant Tomatoes.

OCTOBER

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Lettuce, Chinese Green and White Cabbage, Radish, Beet, Carrot, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Celery, Brussels Sprouts, Endive, Prickly Spinach, Turnip, Parsnip, Salsify, Pea, French Bean, Thyme, Sage Marjoram, Parsley, Chilies, Asparagus, Leek, and Savoy Cabbage.
- Plant Cabbage, Cauliflower, and Celery.
- Potatoes may be planted about the middle of the month.

NOVEMBER

- The same kinds of seeds as last month may be sown either for succession or to replace failures.
- Plant seedlings of Celery, Potatoes, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Brussels Sprouts, Lettuce, and Endive.
- Earth up first bed of Celery, also of Potatoes.
- Tie up Lettuce to blanch them. Lettuce plants through the summer will never be big enough to tie up, but with cooler weather the plants will be bigger.

DECEMBER

- Seeds of the following may be sown: Mustard and Cress, Lettuce, Radish, Cabbage, Celery, Turnip, Peas and French Beans.
- Plant seedlings of Celery, Cabbage, Cauliflower, and Lettuce.
- Earth up Celery and Potatoes.
- Keep the soil well stirred in the beds and see that everything is watered sufficiently.
